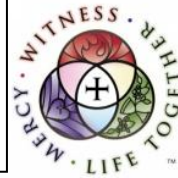

Pre-Lent will be shaped by the three solas (alones) of the Reformation. **Grace Alone** is seen in the birth, ministry, suffering, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus; who accomplished all these things for you and me and all people. We receive their benefits by the means of Grace, through the preaching and teaching of His Word, and the Sacraments of Baptism, Absolution (forgiveness) and Communion. It is through **Faith Alone**, that we receive these gifts. Faith is a gift of the Holy Ghost, by which we receive the free gifts of God: forgiveness, life and eternal salvation. **Scripture Alone**, places God's Holy Word, the Bible, ahead of human reason. Scripture Alone is the sole source of doctrine and practice within the Church. All three have one purpose, pointing us to **Christ Alone**.
